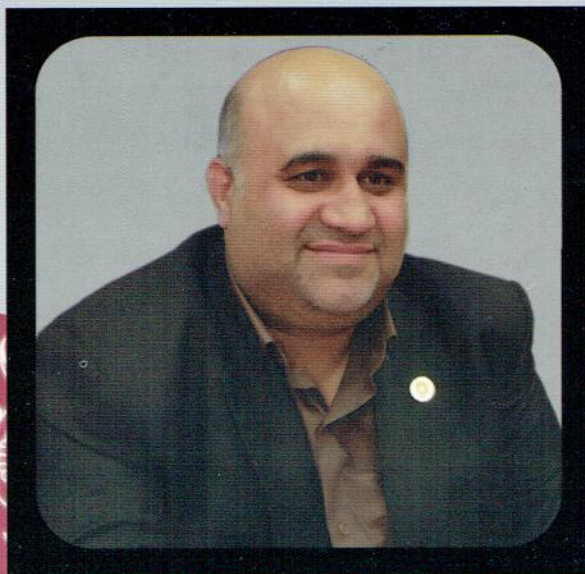

I am looking forward to meeting you all in Shiraz City, Iran.

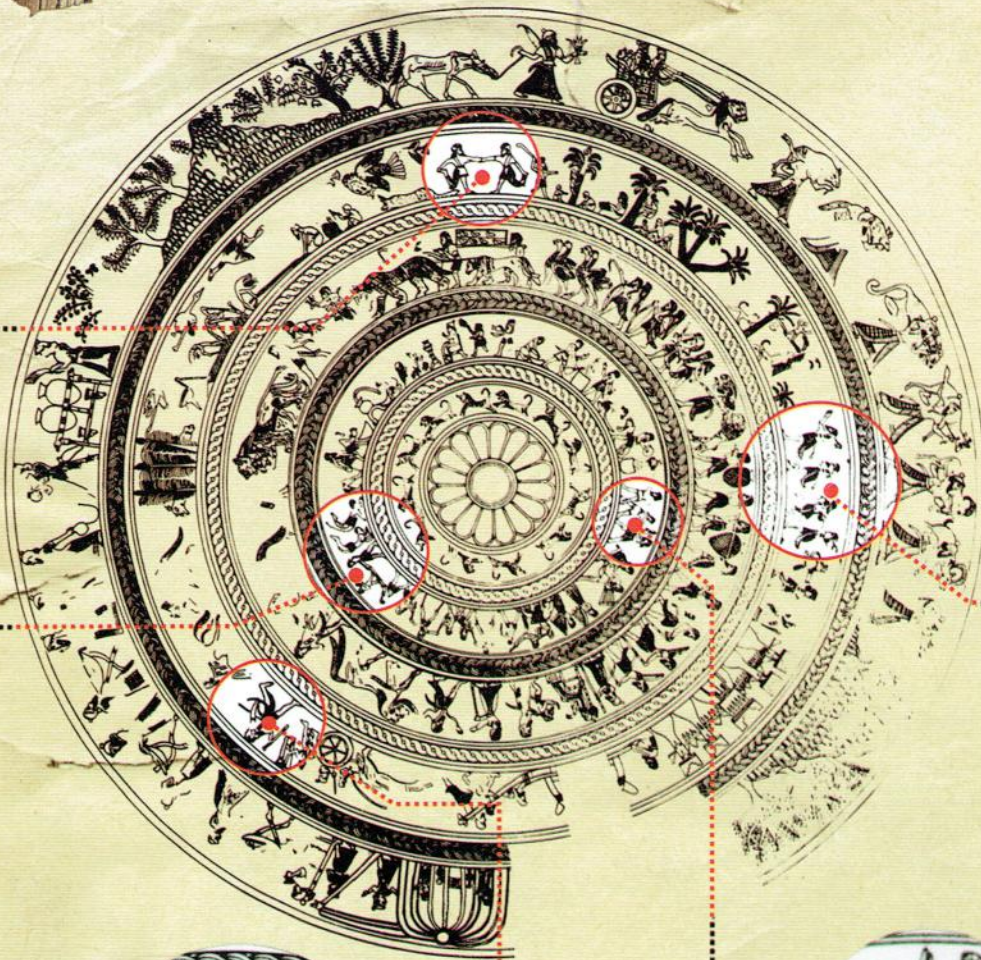

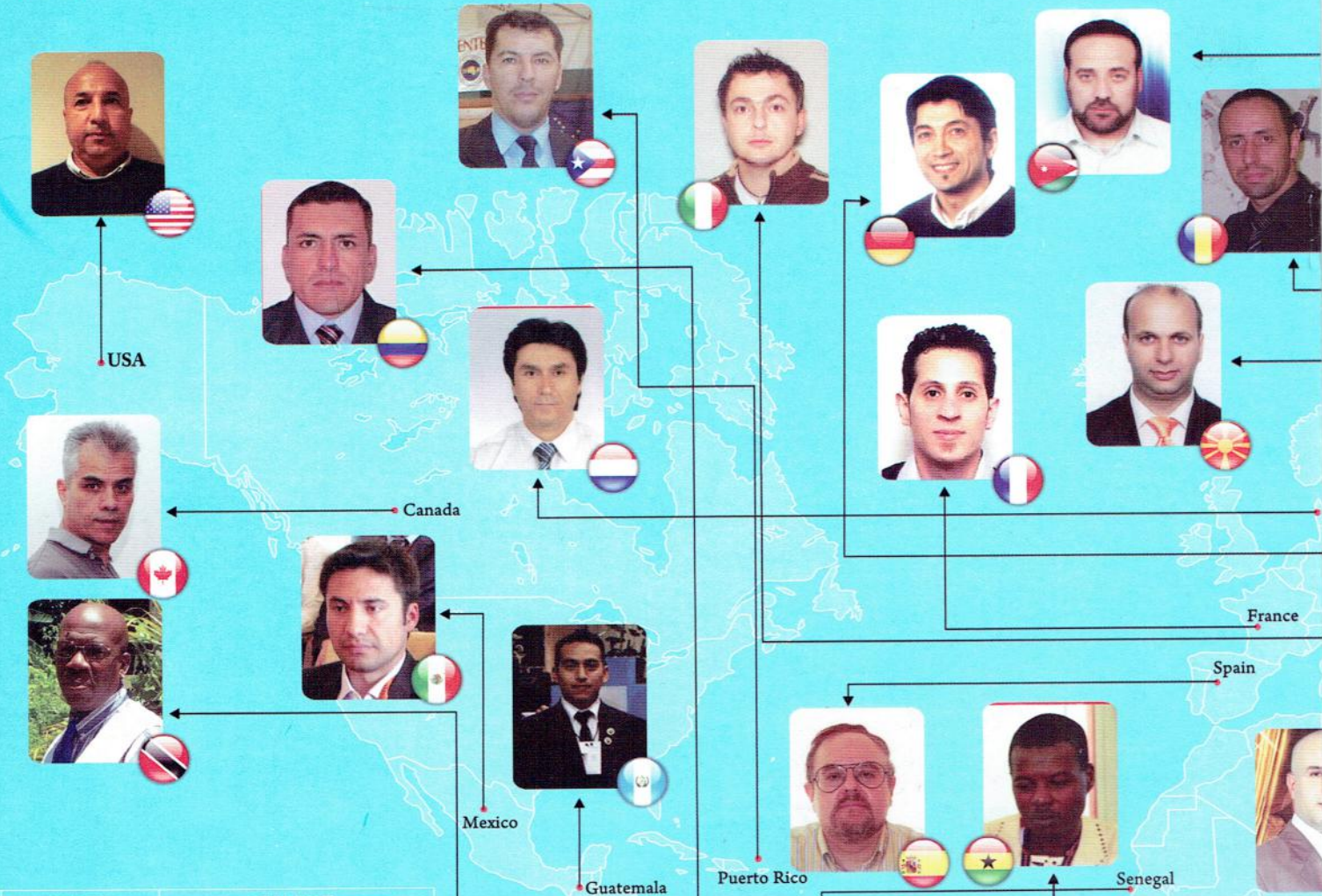

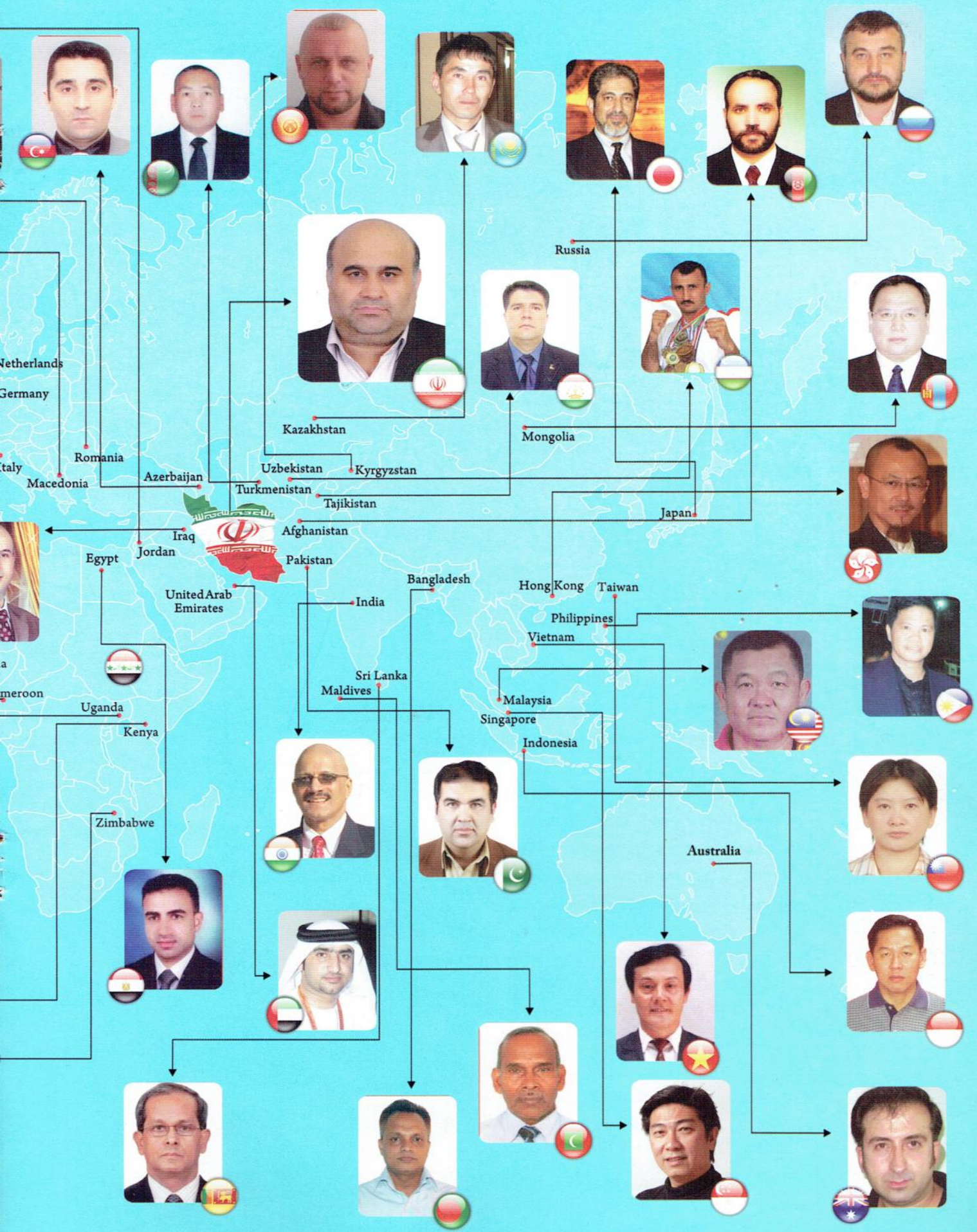

The opening Ceremony of 1st International Coaching and Refereeing Certification Course

The first International Coaching and Refereeing Certification Course of WUTA was organized from 9th to 17th of December, 2010 in National Olympic & Paralympic Academy of Tehran-Iran.

54 coaches and referees from 27 countries participated in this course.

The sport authorities of Physical Education Organization and the Executive Board Members of WUTA and other guests participated in the opening ceremony of this course. Mr. Seyyed Mojtaba Shirzadi, the WUTA executive secretary, made a welcome speech and kept informed the guests the agenda of the course.

The ceremony started with the recitation of Qoran and Iran's National Anthem was broadcasted and then Mr. Taleghani, Vice President of Iran's National Federation, also made a welcome speech. Later, Mr. Montazeri, WUTA President, give a report of WUTA activities to the audience. After that, the audience was invited to watch the video clip pertinent to the general assembly and annual congress of Esfahan and other WUTA activities. Next, everyone's attention was drawn to the speeches made by Mr. Reghbat, General Director of Programming Department of Physical Education Organization, Mr. Suresh Gopi, WUTA Senior Vice President, and Mr. Garosi, a Member of Parliament of I.R. Iran.

- * the technical part

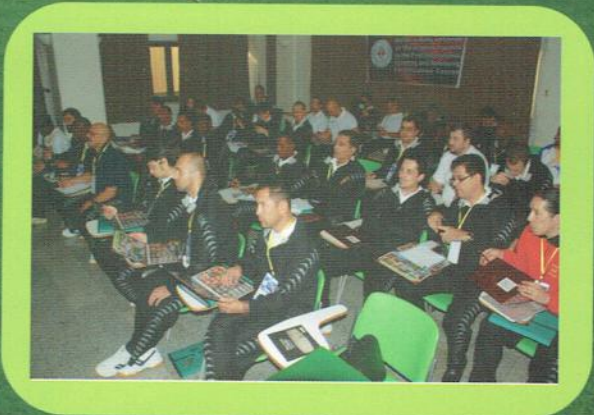
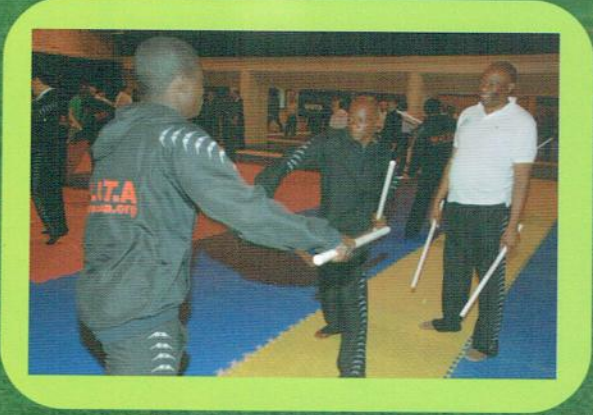
Concurrent with this course, the Executive Board members held some meetings to investigate the activities done and the future schedule of WUTA.

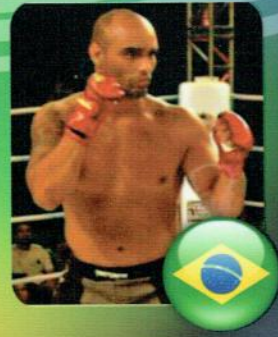
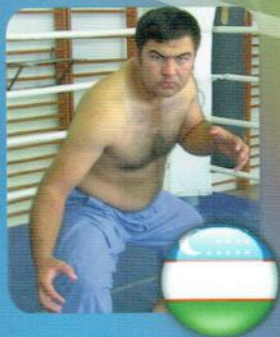
The 1st World Championship of WUTA is held from 6th to 12th of November in the historical and cultural city of Shiraz. The official invitations were sent to 100 countries and so far 20 countries have expressed their willingness to participate in the event.

However, it should be noted that representatives of 35 countries were trained the three mentioned styles in the 1st International coaching and refereeing Certification Course held from 9th to 17th of December, 2010 in National Olympic and paralympic Academy Iran. Also, the training film pertinent to the WUTA refereeing rules and regulations was sent to the representatives and is available in the WUTA Site.

The presence of the World Sports Authorities and Iran's governmental, sporting, cultural officials adds grace to the opening ceremony of the championship in Persepolis.
